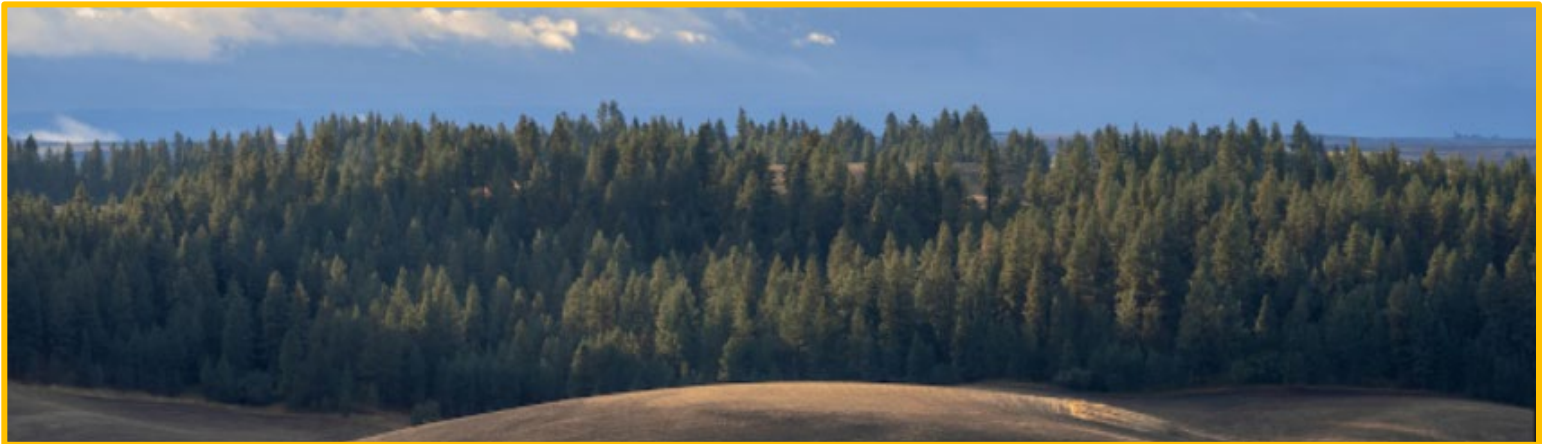
Associate Director for Clinical Training Programs; Counseling and Mental Health Center

The Division of Student Affairs at the University of Idaho is seeking dedicated psychologists to join our team in a non-tenure track assistant or associate professor for a clinical faculty position at our Counseling and Mental Health Center (CMHC) in the role of Associate Director for Clinical Training Programs.

Applicants should be professionals who are passionate about making a meaningful difference in a scholarly community and in the lives of individuals facing mental health challenges and training the next generation of clinical practitioners. As the state's land-grant institution, the University of Idaho offers an unparalleled opportunity to engage in a community committed to academic excellence, holistic student success, and comprehensive wellness and mental health services to our diverse student population.

Position Summary

The University of Idaho Counseling and Mental Health Center (CMHC) is searching for a psychologist to join our clinical staff, provide leadership of its APA-accredited doctoral internship training program and contribute to the agency's core administrative services. The Associate Director for Clinical Training (AD) has primary responsibility for all facets of the doctoral internship program, including the recruitment and selection of interns, coordination of training activities, clinical supervision of interns and program evaluation. The AD also ensures that the CMHC's policies and procedures comply with the APA Standards of Accreditation. In addition, the AD provides leadership for the doctoral practicum training program and the social work field placement. The AD will frequently serve in a consulting role related to risk management, professional ethics and mental health law associated with the CMHC's training programs.

The AD serves on the CMHC's leadership team along with the Executive Director, the Associate Director for Clinical Services and the Administrative Services Coordinator. The AD has a lead role in developing policies and procedures that promote accessible mental health services for students, align with best practices in the field and conform with the standards of practice for each training program (i.e., APA, APPIC, NASW, etc.). The AD coordinates the selection process for all training programs, including the doctoral internship match. The AD provides administrative support to all professional staff who participate in the training programs and provides input to the Executive Director on their performance in supervisory and training roles. The responsibilities associated with this position also include quality assurance, program evaluation, coordination of APA site visits and compilation of program area reports.

In addition to the administrative role, primary responsibilities include direct service to clients, crisis coverage, outreach and consultation to the campus community and after-hours response to campus events. The position is classified as clinical faculty and is a full-time, 12-month appointment at the rank of assistant or associate professor. The AD will be expected to engage in scholarship and creative activities which may include professional presentations, program development and/or research and publications. This position includes a 7.5% administrative stipend along with the \$90,000 base salary at the rank of Assistant Professor. Candidates must currently hold the rank of Associate Professor to be considered for the rank of Associate Professor and commensurate salary.

Required Qualifications

(Listed degree qualification is required at time of hire.)

- PhD, PsyD, Doctorate in counseling/clinical psychology from an APA accredited program
- Psychologist Licensure in current state of residence and eligibility for licensure as a psychologist in the State of Idaho and licensure as a psychologist within 6 months of hire
- A minimum of 2 years post-graduate experience and at least one of those years must include administrative or significant leadership experience as a professional psychologist
- Experience providing clinical supervision and/or facilitating training seminars with doctoral practicum students and/or doctoral interns
- Experience in providing clinical services to an adult population
- Experience in providing risk assessment and crisis intervention
- Experience in working with a multidisciplinary team and a commitment to work effectively as a team leader in a culture that values collaboration and trust

Preferred Qualifications

- Experience in a college or university counseling center
- APA accredited internship in a college or university counseling center
- Administrative and supervisory experience in organizational management
- Experience in providing culturally competent services to a diverse client population
- Experience and interest in providing brief counseling
- Experience having produced scholarly activity (professional presentations, research, publications)

Note: Applicants who are selected as final possible candidates must be able to pass a criminal background check.

Employee acknowledges and agrees that in the event there is no longer a need for the administrative assignment, as determined by the University in its sole discretion, University may change this Agreement and remove the administrative salary and/or course release during the contract year and employee may return to their faculty appointment, upon 60 days written notice.

The Counseling and Mental Health Center (CMHC) is the primary provider of mental health services for the University of Idaho student population. The CMHC offers individual and group counseling, crisis intervention, psychiatric services, psychological testing, alcohol and other drug programming, outreach, campus liaisons and consultative services. The CMHC utilizes a developmental model, focusing on personal development, coping skills, treatment, and wellness within a brief therapy framework. The CMHC is deeply committed to building a welcoming, affirming, and supportive environment for all students that reduces stigma and increases access to mental health services. The CMHC also has an APA accredited doctoral internship in professional psychology.



Counseling and Psychological Services

The Counseling and Mental Health Center's (CMHC) staff of psychologists and supervised doctoral interns and graduate students offers students a wide range of counseling services, resources and referrals.

The CMHC is committed to offering services that are inclusive and respectful of all students, regardless of race and/or ethnicity, sex, color, religion, spirituality, creed, national origin or ancestry, age, marital status, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, disability or veteran status.

Alcohol & Other Drugs Services

Services are designed to help students assess alcohol and other drug use, explore the need to change behaviors and learn ways to reduce negative consequences and harm.

Psychological Assessment

Psychological assessment at the Counseling and Mental Health Center (CMHC) includes assessment of various psychological and neurocognitive conditions, including but not limited to ADHD, learning disorders, traumatic brain injuries, autism spectrum disorder, personality disorders and many more. At the U of I CMHC, assessments are primarily provided as part of our [doctoral internship training program](#) and by a limited number of our staff members.

Satellite Location Clinical Services

University of Idaho (CMHC) on the Moscow campus offers telehealth (online) counseling sessions with our team of social workers and psychologists, initial psychiatric consultations with a psychiatric nurse practitioner as well as case management assistance to University of Idaho students at U of I's five satellite locations.

Outreach & Consultation

The CMHC provides educational programs to student groups on many topics, including stress management, anxiety, relationships, depression and communication skills. Consultation is available to students, staff, faculty and parents to discuss concerns about students who are experiencing difficulties and recommend how to respond to and refer these students.

APA Accredited Doctoral Internship

University of Idaho Counseling and Mental Health Center's (CMHC) APA-accredited doctoral internship offers training, supervision, and mentorship to facilitate the development of advanced skills and professional identity in the setting of a busy university counseling center.

The University of Idaho

Candidates will enter the university at an exciting point in its over 130-year-old lifespan, with the previous two years seeing the two largest first-year student classes in university history. The University of Idaho leads education, research, and outreach. Its nearly 12,000 students come from all 50 states and around the world, with a solid base of Idaho students that continues to grow.

In 2025 we expect to be the [first university in Idaho](#) to achieve the highest level of classification for research activity (R1) as determined by the Carnegie Classification. 2023 marked the fourth year in a row that the U of I was ranked as the Best Value Public University in the West by U.S. News and World Report, and second nationally behind the University of North Carolina..

In addition to being the leading research institution in the state, the university is also a land-grant institution, with [46 extension centers](#) in 42 of Idaho's 44 counties. These centers support researchers, educators, and specialists in the disciplines of forestry and natural resources, horticulture, aquaculture, and much more, in a long-standing effort to empower youth and develop communities across Idaho.

As a noted national leader in student-centered learning and interdisciplinary research that promotes public service, the university combines the strength of a large university with the intimacy of small learning
