

Applicants should be dynamic professionals who are passionate about promoting mental health awareness, providing comprehensive counseling services, and advancing initiatives that support the diverse needs of our campus population.

Position Summary

The new Director for the Counseling and Mental Health Center (CMHC) will be responsible for leading university-wide initiatives addressing student mental health and the overall direction, management, and leadership of a multi-disciplinary and talented team of twenty-two individuals that is charged with expanding and strengthening the range of mental health services provided to the students of the University of Idaho (both on the main campus located in Moscow and at the various distance/remote learning sites throughout the state).

The successful candidate will serve as the chief psychologist for the university and provide administrative supervision to a multidisciplinary staff of mental health practitioners, including psychologists, a psychiatric nurse practitioner, and master's level clinicians. The position will have administrative responsibility for university mental health services, including psychiatry, case management, and oversight of 24-hour crisis intervention contracted service. The position will manage personnel issues, including the recruitment and hiring of positions, provide leadership for the CMHC administrative team, supervise a nationally accredited Testing Center, and direct the CMHC operational, budgetary, and financial responsibilities.

The Director will provide administrative supervision for the CMHC's APA-accredited doctoral internship training program and provide oversight and management of electronic clinical record system, clinical outcomes, and quality assurance of CMHC programs. The Director may serve on two institutional behavior intervention teams (CARE and Threat Assessment) and will provide administrative supervision to the university suicide behavior assessment team. The Director is responsible for the CMHC's by-laws and promotion process, in conjunction with the Vice Provost for Student Affairs' office.

The Director provide oversight for the programs within the CMHC which includes clinical services to students entailing initial appointments, crisis intervention, individual counseling and case management activities within the CMHC's established clinical model. The CMHC offers a broad range of clinical services which include individual and group counseling, psychiatric services, psychological assessment, alcohol and other drug programming, biofeedback and trauma-informed treatments.

The Director will also be expected to engage program development to assist with furthering outreach to the student population campus. The Director will assist on committees for the exploration of an expansion of health and wellness facilities to assist with university growth and CMHC needs.

This position is a key leader within the Division of Student Affairs, retaining a seat on the Executive Director Leadership Team and reports directly to the Vice Provost for Student Affairs

Candidates for this position will have strong clinical skills and a history of progressive leadership within a mental health clinical setting with a strong skillset in management and supervision of a diverse, dedicated team of professionals and they will have a record of successful publication and research within a related disciplinary field. This position is a key leader within the Division of Student Affairs, retaining a seat on the Executive Director leadership team and reports directly to the Vice Provost for Student Affairs.



Required Qualifications

- Doctoral degree in counseling or clinical psychology from an APA accredited program
- Five years of progressive leadership within a mental health clinical setting
- Experience working with a multidisciplinary team in a fast-paced and dynamic work environment providing clinical services, risk assessment and crisis interventions to an adult and diverse client population
- Licensure or ability to become a licensed psychologist in the state of Idaho within one year of employment
- Ability to respond to critical university incidents after hours and/or weekends
- Ability to travel occasionally





Preferred Qualifications

- Experience in Leadership and directorship in a clinical setting
- Experience in a university counseling center
- Demonstrated history of presentations at professional conferences and meetings
- Experience serving on behavior intervention teams
- Understanding of and appreciation for the intersection between clinical health services and behavioral health in an integrated model of patient care
- Experience providing psychological assessments to the adult population
- Experience, professional skills, and commitment to working with students, colleagues, and stakeholders from a wide range of backgrounds, life experiences, abilities, and perspectives
- Experience with multilingual skills



The Counseling and Mental Health Center

The Counseling and Mental Health Center (CMHC) is the primary provider of mental health services for the University of Idaho student population. The CMHC offers individual and group counseling, crisis intervention, psychiatric services, psychological testing, alcohol and other drug programming, outreach, campus liaisons and consultative services. The CMHC utilizes a developmental model, focusing on personal development, coping skills, treatment, and wellness within a brief therapy framework. The CMHC is deeply committed to building a welcoming, affirming, and supportive environment for all students that reduces stigma and increases access to mental health services. The CMHC also has an APA accredited doctoral internship in professional psychology.





Counseling and Psychological Services

The Counseling and Mental Health Center's (CMHC) staff of psychologists and supervised doctoral interns and graduate students offers students a wide range of counseling services, resources and referrals.

The CMHC is committed to offering services that are inclusive and respectful of all students, regardless of race and/or ethnicity, sex, color, religion, spirituality, creed, national origin or ancestry, age, marital status, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, disability or veteran status.

Alcohol & Other Drugs Services

Services are designed to help students assess alcohol and other drug use, explore the need to change behaviors and learn ways to reduce negative consequences and harm.

Psychological Assessment

Psychological assessment at the Counseling and Mental Health Center (CMHC) includes assessment of various psychological and neurocognitive conditions, including but not limited to ADHD, learning disorders, traumatic brain injuries, autism spectrum disorder, personality disorders and many more. At the U of I CMHC, assessments are primarily provided as part of our <u>doctoral internship training program</u> and by a limited number of our staff members.

Satellite Location Clinical Services

University of Idaho (CMHC) on the Moscow campus offers telehealth (online) counseling sessions with our team of social workers and psychologists, initial psychiatric consultations with a psychiatric nurse practitioner as well as case management assistance to University of Idaho students at U of I's five satellite locations.

Outreach & Consultation


The CMHC provides educational programs to student groups on many topics, including stress management, anxiety, relationships, depression and communication skills. Consultation is available to students, staff, faculty and parents to discuss concerns about students who are experiencing difficulties and recommend how to respond to and refer these students.

APA Accredited Doctoral Internship

University of Idaho Counseling and Mental Health Center's (CMHC) APA-accredited doctoral internship offers training, supervision, and mentorship to facilitate the development of advanced skills and professional identity in the setting of a busy university counseling center.

The University of Idaho

Candidates will enter the university at an exciting point in its over 130-year-old lifespan, with the previous two years seeing the two largest first-year student classes in university history. The University of Idaho leads education, research, and outreach. Its nearly 12,000 students come from all 50 states and around the world, with a solid base of Idaho students that continues to grow.



U of I is a residential university with its main campus in Moscow, Idaho. It serves students statewide with centers in Boise, Coeur d'Alene, and Idaho Falls. Recognized as a Carnegie Foundation "higher research activity" university, U of I's research trajectory, includes expenditures of \$115.5 million in 2022. In 2025 we expect to be the <u>first university in Idaho</u> to achieve the highest level of classification for research activity (R1) as determined by the Carnegie Classification. 2023 marked the fourth year in a row that the U of I was ranked as the Best Value Public University in the West by U.S. News and World Report, and second nationally behind the University of North Carolina.

In addition to being the leading research institution in the state, the university is also a land-grant institution, with <u>46 extension centers</u> in 42 of Idaho's 44 counties. These centers support researchers, educators, and specialists in the disciplines of forestry and natural resources, horticulture, aquaculture, and much more, in a long-standing effort to empower youth and develop communities across Idaho.

As a noted national leader in student-centered learning and interdisciplinary research that promotes public service, the university combines the strength of a large university with the intimacy of small learning communities and a focus on helping students succeed and become leaders. More than 2,500 faculty and staff support and guide over 100 Bachelor's, 63 Master's, and 32 doctoral degree options in the colleges of:
