

The South Carolina Institute on the Prevention of Sexual Violence on College Campuses (SCIP) seeks an experienced Director of Development. Applications and nominations are being accepted.

ABOUT THE INSTITUTE

In 2022, the Governor and General Assembly of South Carolina authorized the creation of the South Carolina Institute on the Prevention of Sexual Violence on College Campuses (SCIP). Lander University (LU) President Dr. Richard Cosentino requested the chartering of the Institute to solidify a more unified and collaborative approach by higher education institutions across the state to end and respond effectively to interpersonal violence. The Institute is chartered at Lander University, which has campuses in Greenwood and Greenville, SC. The Institute's offices are located in Greenville, SC.

The goal of the Institute is to reduce the prevalence of interpersonal violence on college and university campuses in South Carolina and introduce best practice standards for the successful care of survivors accessing intervention and support services. These standards and practices will be available to all participating institutions through educational programming, informational materials, online resources, an annual conference, and the option for individualized campus support.

The Institute's participants will be comprised of university leaders from around the state. The Institute's multiday summer conference will be hosted annually for all participating South Carolina colleges and universities. The conference will include national and state subject-matter experts and focus on current trends, legislation, and best practices for topics/issues related to interpersonal violence on college campuses (e.g., domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, sexual exploitation, sexual harassment, etc.); victim support services; standardization of reporting, continuity of care; Title IX; Violence Against Women Act (VAWA); Jeanne Clery Act; Tucker Hipps Transparent Act; and more. This conference will provide clarity and insight into best practices while preparing participating institutions for students and the year ahead. The Institute will also be instrumental in facilitating research opportunities for participating institutions relative to the prevention of sexual and interpersonal violence on college campuses.

THE OPPORTUNITY

SCIP seeks a dynamic and visionary major gifts officer. The position will be responsible for identifying, cultivating, soliciting, and stewarding constituents to generate major gifts in support of The Institute. The individual will be donor-focused and committed to enhancing relationships that will result in the advancement of the Institute's long-term goals.

This position reports directly to the Executive Director of The Institute, who in turn reports directly to the President of Lander University and Chair of the Institute and National Advisory Board. A key priority of this position is to close major gifts from \$25,000 to \$500,000.

SCIP aims to play a vital role in the coordination and collaboration of strategic development of best practice standards across higher education campuses to (1) prevent interpersonal violence and (2) introduce protocols for the successful care of survivors accessing intervention and support services.

Director of Development Duties and Responsibilities

- Develop and present proposals to prospects/donors for funding
- Close major gifts from \$25,000 to \$500,000
- Travel, as necessary
- Utilize Blackbaud Raiser's Edge experience or similar CRM software to manage data
- Available for nights and weekends, as needed

Qualifications

Candidate must have a bachelor's degree and a minimum of 3-6 years of fundraising experience, preferably in higher education or other non-profits and/or foundations. and a proven record of closing major gifts.

President Richard E. Cosentino

Richard E. Cosentino, Ph.D., began his tenure as Lander University's 12th president on July 1, 2015. He has over 30 years of experience in higher education as a senior administrative and financial executive and a background in fundraising, enrollment management, and governmental relations.

Dr. Cosentino came to Lander from the University of North Carolina at Pembroke (UNC-P), where he was the Vice Chancellor for Finance & Administration. He was responsible for strategic management and leadership in over a dozen areas, including budget and financial planning, information technology, human resources, risk management, procurement, and facilities management. A native of Baltimore, Md., Dr. Cosentino has a Bachelor of Science in business administration with a major in finance and a Master of Business Administration with a major in strategic financial planning from the University of Baltimore in Maryland. He earned a Ph.D. in engineering from The George Washington University (GWU) in Washington, D.C.

Prior to UNC-P, Dr. Cosentino was an Assistant and Associate Vice President for Finance and Administration at GWU and Vice Dean for Finance and Administrative Affairs in the university's School of Engineering and Applied Science. He also worked as a Senior Budget Manager at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine and as a Senior Administrator and Director of Budget and Finance at the University of Maryland School of Medicine. He has presented at national conferences, addressing contemporary issues affecting higher education. His particular interest is the fielding of complex enterprise class systems in higher education environments.
