About

University System of Georgia

The University System of Georgia (USG) is one of the largest and most respected systems for higher education in the United States. USG has been cited nationally for its excellent leadership, academic innovation, state government support and rise in student achievement.

Among other accomplishments, USG has pioneered intervention and support systems to increase student access to college, close performance gaps and improve graduation rates as a member of Complete College America. And the groundbreaking Momentum Approach initiative has drawn national attention for its use of data-driven analysis and increased support of all USG students, driving up retention and completion rates as more students stay on track toward degree attainment. Since 2011, USG has experienced a 39.6% increase in students earning degrees annually. In FY 2024 alone, USG graduates received a record 76,571 degrees — the most in system history.

With 26 public colleges and universities across Georgia, USG enrolls 344,000 students, employs over 48,000 staff and faculty and has a statewide economic impact of \$21.9 billion. The system and its institutions play a critically important role in local economies across the state, offer degree programs ranging from associate through doctorate and help drive Georgia's economy.

State Universities

USG's state universities including Savannah State University are recognized as among the best in their region of the state and share a <u>common mission</u> to have:

- A commitment to excellence and responsiveness within a scope of influence defined by the needs of an area of the state, and by particularly outstanding programs or distinctive characteristics that have a magnet effect throughout the region or state;
- A commitment to a teaching/learning environment, both inside and outside the classroom, that sustains instructional excellence, serves a diverse and college-prepared student body, promotes high levels of student achievement, offers academic assistance and provides developmental studies programs for a limited student cohort;
- A high-quality general education program supporting a variety of disciplinary, interdisciplinary and professional academic programming at the baccalaureate level, with selected master's and educational specialist degrees and selected associate degree programs based on area need and/or inter-institutional collaborations;
- A commitment to public service, continuing education, technical assistance and economic development activities that address the needs, improve the quality of life and raise the educational level within the university's scope of influence; and
- A commitment to scholarly and creative work to enhance instructional effectiveness and to encourage faculty scholarly pursuits, and a commitment to applied research in selected areas of institutional strength and area need. In addition to these core characteristics, Fort Valley State University and Savannah State University both have unique and distinct statewide missions as 1890 land-grant institutions. Both they and Albany State University are USG's three HBCUs.

With an overall mission of research, teaching and service, USG and its governing Board of Regents are constitutionally independent but traditionally enjoy strong support from the Governor's Office and the Georgia General Assembly.

The size and scope of USG are among its greatest strengths, allowing for both an economy of scale and a diversity of missions that reach every corner of Georgia and all 159 of the state's counties. Its 26 higher education institutions uniquely include four research universities, four comprehensive universities, nine state universities and nine state colleges — for a total of four sectors.

Board of Regents

With its creation in 1931, the Board of Regents became the single governing and management authority over USG.

The governor appoints members of the Board to a seven-year term, and regents may be reappointed to subsequent terms by a sitting governor. Regents donate their time and expertise to serve the state in a position that is a voluntary one without financial remuneration. Today, the Board is composed of 19 members, five of whom are appointed from the state-at-large and one from each of the state's 14 congressional districts.

The Board elects a Chancellor who serves as its chief executive officer and oversees the public colleges

and universities that comprise USG as well as the Georgia Archives and the Georgia Public Library Service (GPLS).

Savannah State University

Savannah State University (SSU) is the first public historically Black college and university (HBCU) in Georgia and the first institution of higher learning in the city of Savannah. The school was established in 1890 with the Second Morrill Land Grant Act, which mandated that southern and border states develop land-grant colleges for black citizens. Later that year, the Georgia General Assembly passed legislation creating the Georgia State Industrial College for Colored Youths, which served as Georgia's 1890 land-grant institution until 1947. A



preliminary session of the college was held in the Baxter Street School Building in Athens before moving to Savannah in October 1891.

Upon the creation of USG in 1932, the college became one of the first members of the system, and its name was changed to Georgia State College. Its name changed again in 1950 to Savannah State College,

and the institution received initial accreditation from the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) in 1955. The USG Board of Regents elevated the college to university status in 1996 and renamed the institution Savannah State University. SSU strives for excellence in strong curricula, vital program offerings and community engagement.

The university's 201-acre campus in the popular city of Savannah is one of the most picturesque in the state.

The moss-laden sweeping oak trees, expansive marsh and historic architecture are the backdrop for this vibrant residential campus. Savannah State students experience a challenging, energized collegiate life; study relevant academic majors in current and emerging fields; and engage in lectures, cutting-edge research and quality student-faculty engagement in a student-centered learning environment.

Serving 3,100 undergraduate and graduate students, Savannah State provides a supportive yet challenging learning environment with opportunities to establish close student-faculty relationships and relevant social and professional networks. More than 76% of students attend full-time, and over 81% are Georgia residents. The two largest majors are Business Management (14.3%) and Biology (13.6%). The retention rate from Fall 2022 to Fall 2023 of first-time, full-time students was 69.3 percent.

SSU has a strong record in research and grant funding and aggressively seeks funds from federal sources, including the National Institutes of Health and National Science Foundation. Grants compose approximately 10% of Savannah State's annual budget and directly support the university's mission to achieve student success. These grants support curriculum enhancement, faculty and student research, student scholarships, presentations at conferences and other scholarly activities.

Overview

Mission

As the first public historically Black university in Georgia, Savannah State develops productive members of a global society through high-quality instruction, scholarship, research, service and community involvement. The university fosters engaged learning and personal growth in a student-centered environment that celebrates its African American legacy while nurturing a diverse student body where all are welcome. SSU offers graduate and undergraduate studies including nationally accredited programs in the liberal arts, the sciences and the professions.

Academic Divisions

The university's mission and educational goals are realized through comprehensive program offerings in the College of Business Administration; the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences; the College of Sciences and Technology; and the College of Education.

College of Business Administration

- Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship provides access to education for business and smart product development, faculty expertise, coaching, programming and financial counseling to encourage the development of technology-based ventures.
- Among the small percentage of business schools globally to be accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business International.

College of Education

- SSU offers the Robert Noyce Teacher Scholarship Program in response to the critical need for K-12 teachers of science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) by encouraging talented STEM students and professionals to pursue teaching careers in elementary and secondary schools.
- This year, USG approved an expansion of the college to include a new program in elementary education, which will help alleviate the state's teacher shortage.
- SSU in 2022 was awarded a grant from the U.S. Department of Education for \$3.1 million to continue the Upward Bound program for an additional five-year period beginning in June 2023.

College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences

- SSU is one of only a few institutions in the country to offer a Bachelor of Arts degree in Homeland Security and Emergency Management.
- One of two universities in Georgia accredited by the Accrediting Council on Education in Journalism and Mass Communications.
- SSU's partnership with the Georgia Film Academy provides a unique-in-the-nation collaboration and rigorous professional training for job placement in the state's \$2.6 billion film industry.

College of Sciences and Technology

• No. 1 producer nationally of African American graduates in marine sciences.

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- Only HBCU in Georgia offering a bachelor's degree in computer science technology with cybersecurity track.
- Forensic science program offers unique virtual reality crime scene training facility including two degree paths: forensic biology and forensic chemistry.
- One of two universities in Georgia to offer an engineering technology education program.

Athletics & Extracurriculars

• Savannah State holds championships in multiple divisions and conferences across several of its programs, and has produced professional baseball players, basketball players, football players, an

NFL Hall of Famer and multiple Olympic athletes. Today, the Tigers compete at the NCAA Division II level with 12 of 15 sports vying in the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC).

- In addition to its academic support programs and extracurricular activities, the University has exhibits, performances, sports teams, concerts and community volunteer service projects geared to strengthening relationships with neighborhoods in the greater Savannah area.
- This year, SSU debuted a new turf football field in the Theodore A. Wright Stadium. The Arthur M. Blank Family Foundation selected the university as one of four HBCUs in Georgia and Alabama to receive new turf fields in order to improve field quality, safety and accessibility for students and local community groups serving youth through football.
